### Catherine C. Marron Elected to Children's Health Fund Board of Trustees

In 1985, she joined Condé Nast Publications beginning a new career in magazine journalism as an editor at *Vogue* and *House & Garden*. Since the birth of her children, she has been active as a Trustee of both The New York Public Library, where she currently oversees a \$1.2 billion multi-faceted campaign, and Thirteen/WNET New York.
