

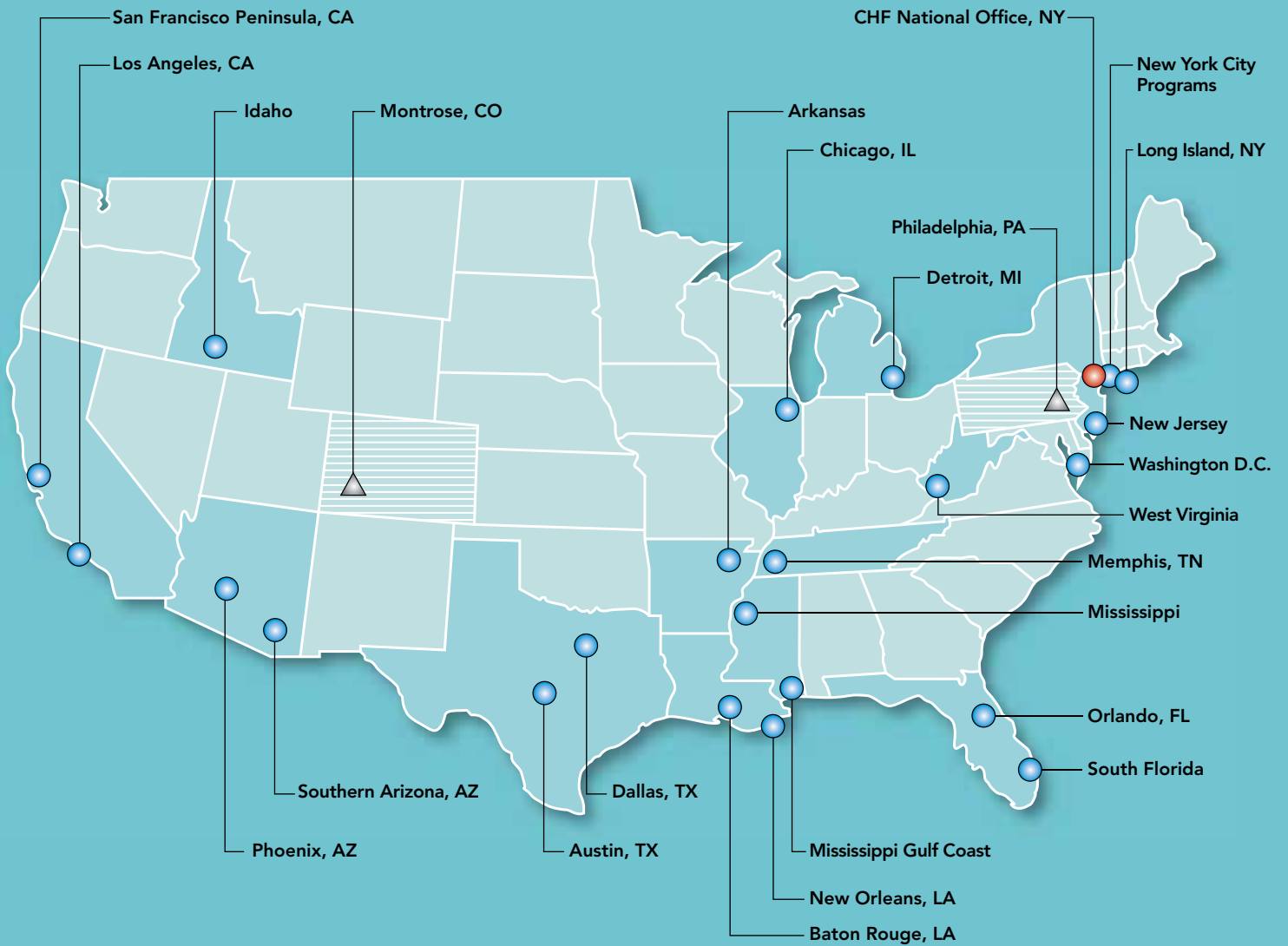

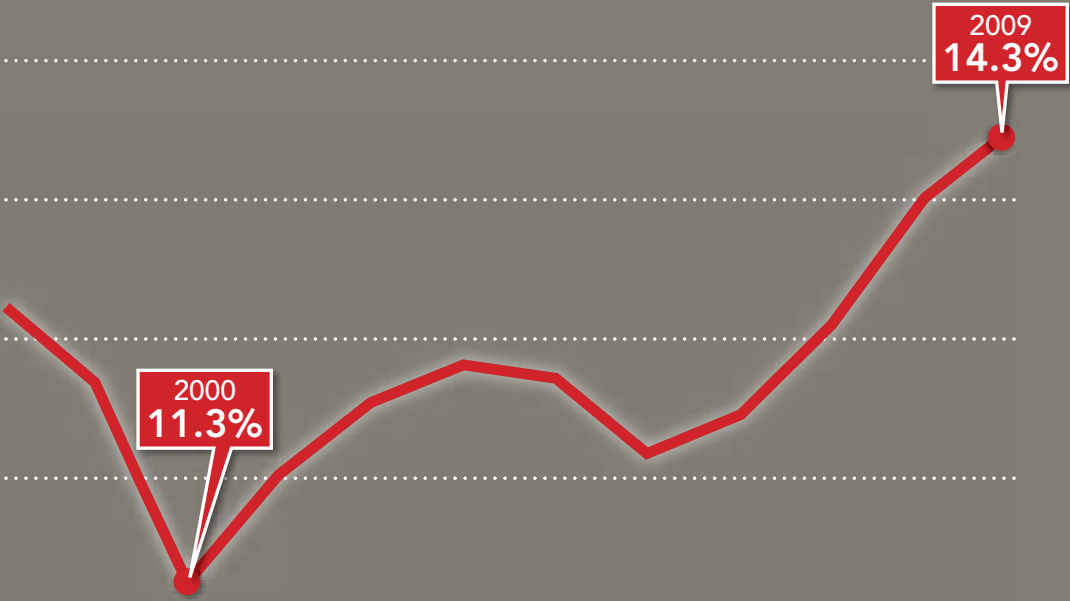

Children's Health Fund programs provide 250,000 health care visits to children and family members annually. Our patients live in deep poverty, in isolated communities and in homeless shelters. Surprisingly, lack of health insurance is not their most significant challenge – no nearby doctors or lack of transportation to get to the doctor are their most significant barriers to care. And failing to provide children the services they need, when they need it, can mean a lifetime of irreversible medical and mental health consequences. Children's Health Fund has been saying that "kids can't wait" for care. This important reality is our driving force, regardless of the Great Recession and the myriad of other complex issues plaguing the country and Capitol Hill.

And although the 2010 passage of health care reform was a historic victory for children, Children's Health Fund will continue to be a voice for the millions of families who still face obstacles to accessing continuous, comprehensive health care.

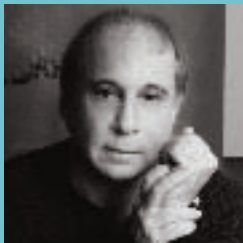

In addition many of our kids continue to experience significant stress resulting from homelessness, hunger, depression and isolation which directly impacts their health and academic achievement. These children are also the least likely to receive timely and comprehensive care. That is why the Children's Health Fund is as important now as when we first began."

**When Veronica noticed that her daughter Kaitlyn had difficulties with body movement and muscle coordination, she became concerned. The family lives in a small Arizona town where specialists are not available. They needed to travel long distances to find one who could offer Kaitlyn the care she needed. Even then, Veronica says "The doctors kept telling me that nothing was wrong. But I knew something was the matter. Kaitlyn wasn't moving right."**

**Last year, Children's Health Fund launched a new Southern Arizona Children's Health Project to care for children and families living in the rural US/Mexico borderlands of Cochise County, Arizona. When Veronica brought Kaitlyn to meet Medical Director Jonathan Lee-Melk, MD, he diagnosed her with cerebral palsy and developmental delay. He connected her to a range of essential services, including physical, occupational and speech therapy. Kaitlyn began to walk; for the first time she began to thrive.**

Only 10% of the nation's physicians practice in rural communities, caring for 25% of our nation's population.<sup>1</sup>

Children's Health Fund's Rural Health programs help families overcome challenges to accessing care. They incorporate several forward-thinking strategies—such as tele-health in Mississippi and school-linked health services—to ensure that children in isolated rural communities have access to quality medical, dental and mental health services.

in urban communities

**Due to economic downturn, relocation, and declining enrollment, dozens of Detroit schools have been forced to close over the last few years. Sometimes those school buildings contain school-based health centers. With each wave of consolidation, those operating the school-based health centers, including Henry Ford Health System, are concerned that access to comprehensive health care will be lost for these students.**

**In 2010, the Children's Health Project of Detroit, a partnership between Henry Ford Health System and Children's Health Fund, was launched with a new mobile medical clinic that better enables Dr. Barone and his team to follow the children to their new schools and maintain relationships with teachers, parents, students and the community, ensuring continuity of care.**

To make things worse, their doctor had moved out of the area. Monica tried to find other doctors, but they were nowhere to be found. Her son, Greg, was so sick he spent more time out of school than in.**

**Monica heard about Children's Health Fund's Mississippi Gulf Coast Children's Health program from a friend and brought Greg to see Medical Director Persharon Dixon, MD. She referred Greg to a specialist and helped the family get to the care he needed in Mobile—45 minutes away. Dr. Dixon brought Greg the medicine he needed and helped get him on a healthy diet. She also kept track of his progress when he returned to school.**

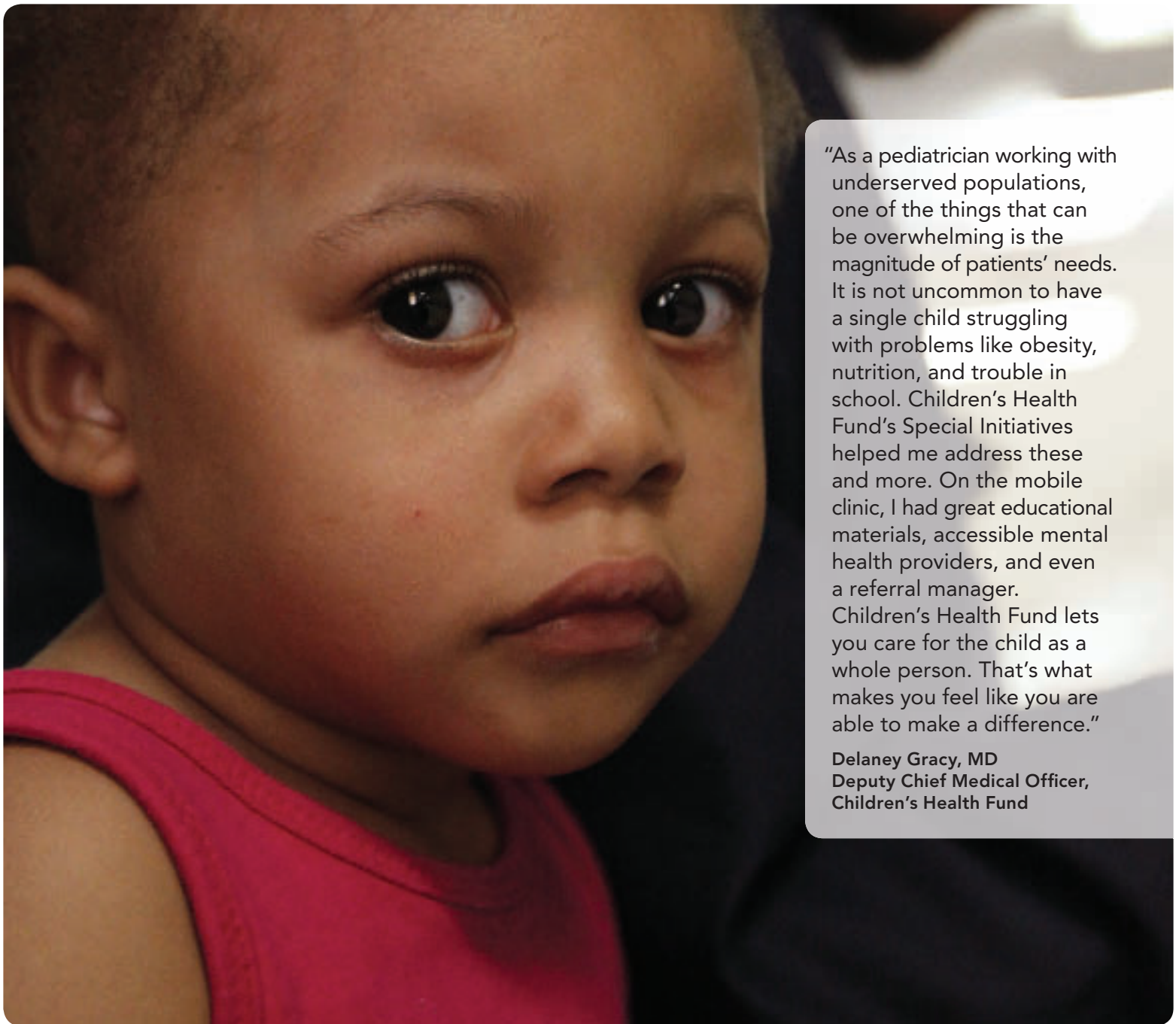

### **Meeting the Growing Need:**

In response to the Deepwater Horizon oil spill, the New Orleans Children's Health Project has added a third mobile clinic to its fleet to bring medical and mental health services to children living in Plaquemines Parish, an area that has seen a large rise in depression, anxiety, loss of income, and domestic violence since the spill.



"As a pediatrician working with underserved populations, one of the things that can be overwhelming is the magnitude of patients' needs. It is not uncommon to have a single child struggling with problems like obesity, nutrition, and trouble in school. Children's Health Fund's Special Initiatives helped me address these and more. On the mobile clinic, I had great educational materials, accessible mental health providers, and even a referral manager. Children's Health Fund lets you care for the child as a whole person. That's what makes you feel like you are able to make a difference."

# Special Health Initiatives

Children’s Health Fund’s (CHF) Special Health Initiatives address pressing health issues faced by poor children. **The Starr Center for Preventive Health and Special Initiatives**, established with support from The Starr Foundation, supports CHF’s New York City Flagship Program as a testing ground where evidence is compiled to support new initiatives. Once the initiatives are found effective, they are replicated nationally.

**Childhood Asthma Initiative** reduces asthma-related hospitalizations and emergency department visits, saving an estimated \$4,525 in annual health care costs per patient — 11 times the cost of the intervention.

Childhood Asthma Initiative is helping children breathe easier in New York City, Tennessee, New Jersey and the District of Columbia.



**Referral Management Initiative (RMI)** has increased the rate of referral completion for specialty services, including cardiology and neurology, from less than 10% to more than 65% – a rate on par with middle class families.

Through our Signature Philanthropic Partnership with **GlaxoSmithKline**, RMI is facilitating referrals to specialty care in New York, Dallas, Florida, Los Angeles, Philadelphia, Memphis and the District of Columbia.

CHF’s South Bronx Health Center for Children and Families’ participation in the **Community-Based Centers of Excellence** Initiative, evaluated by George Washington University’s School of Public Health, has produced evidence that on standardized national clinical measures, the health center outperforms city, state, and national averages. The initiative increases access to care and improves outcomes and quality of care.

## Other Special Health Initiatives

**Medical Home Initiative** which receives Signature Philanthropic Support from **sanofi-aventis U.S.** has helped connect more than 10,000 children in Arkansas, Mississippi, West Virginia, Idaho and New Jersey to comprehensive and timely care.

**Mental Health Initiative** integrates behavioral, developmental and mental health services into primary care environment throughout Children’s Health Fund’s Network of programs, with Signature Philanthropic Support from the **Schering-Plough Foundation**.

**Oral Health Initiative** brings dental care to Children’s Health Fund’s programs in Arkansas, Idaho, Mississippi, New York and Texas, and integrates it into the primary care setting.

**Starting Right Initiative** helps address the obesity epidemic by combining clinical care with nutrition, fitness and wellness programs for children of all ages. 54% of kids who received Starting Right’s nutritional services showed a reduction in their Body Mass Index.

**Child Health Transportation Initiative** calls attention to gaps in transportation systems that keep low-income families from accessing care. With Signature Philanthropic Support from the **W.K. Kellogg Foundation** and **Federal Transit Administration**, CHF funds pilot transportation projects that connect kids to health care, and is developing an index that identifies communities with limited access to both health care and public transportation.

## disaster response

# As many as 20,000 children displaced by Hurricane Katrina are still distressed.

When disasters happen, children are highly prone to injury, displacement and emotional trauma. Children's Health Fund—with the National Center for Disaster Preparedness (NCDP) at Columbia University's Mailman School of Public Health—identifies and responds to the unique needs of children during national crises.

In summer 2010, Children's Health Fund and NCDP released two ground-breaking reports. The **Gulf Coast Child & Family Health Study**—one of the longest running studies on the effects of disasters on children—followed 1,000 hurricane-impacted families for five years. The study, published in an American Medical Association journal, found that **one-third of children in hurricane-displaced families have been diagnosed with mental health problems** since Katrina. Yet fewer than 50% of parents seeking professional counseling for their kids could access services.

The second report, a survey of over 1,200 adults living within miles of the Gulf Coast, was conducted after the capping of the Deepwater Horizon well. The results alarmed America. **Over a third of parents** surveyed said

their **children had experienced physical symptoms or mental health distress as a consequence of the spill.**

The poll made national news, and subsequently, BP announced that it would provide \$52 million to support mental health care in the region—reversing its previous position. ProPublica, a Pulitzer Prize-winning blog, cited Children's Health Fund's study as influencing BP's change of heart.

In response to the Deepwater Horizon disaster, the New Orleans Children's Health Project has added a mobile clinic to serve one of the areas worst-affected by the oil spill: Plaquemines Parish, Louisiana.

## a voice for children

# As implementation of health care reform unfolds, Children's Health Fund will remain a steadfast voice for underserved children.

In 2009, the national debate on health care reform heated up, and Children's Health Fund was part of the discussion. Informed by over 20 years of experience developing medical programs for kids, Children's Health Fund educated policymakers on the health care needs of children, offering solutions to many of the access barriers faced by poor families.

Throughout 2009 and 2010, Children's Health Fund co-founders Paul Simon and Irwin Redlener, MD, were regular faces on Capitol Hill. Meeting with House and Senate leadership, Children's Health Fund emphasized the need to: pass comprehensive health reform, provide coverage to millions of uninsured children and breakdown barriers that block their access to care.

Working in a bipartisan manner, Children's Health Fund brings to light a broad range of issues facing vulnerable kids. In the Spring, Children's Health Fund convened key stakeholders to discuss children and **health information technology**, in what became a standing-room only Congressional briefing.

The Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act is now law, and will take years to implement fully. As implementation decisions are made at the federal and state levels, Children's Health Fund will remain a steadfast voice for underserved children.

For every person that "liked (fans)" Clorox's Facebook page, Clorox donated a \$1 to CHF (up to \$100,000). **MediaCom** used its position as one of the largest strategic planning and buying agency networks in the world to help facilitate the donation of print, radio, out-of-home and digital ad space to the Children's Health Fund. And most recently, **American Express** launched a Children's Health Fund gift card that donates back an amount equal to 100% of the Gift Card fee to the Children's Health Fund.
