



## Bronx Health Collective



Bronx Health Collective (BHC) is a program of Montefiore Medical Center and the flagship program of Children's Health Fund. BHC has served New York City's (NYC) most marginalized children and families for over 30 years, and is located in the poorest congressional district in the nation. BHC serves some of the city's most vulnerable populations, including children and families living in the South Bronx as well as those living in NYC's shelter system. BHC operates through a network of community health centers, mobile medical units, and shelter-based clinics. The medical home model of care that BHC employs is designed to address the complex health and psychosocial needs across the lifespan, offering co-located primary care, mental health counseling, case management, and nutrition services. In addition to comprehensive clinical care, BHC provides integrated prenatal, perinatal, and family planning services, substance use disorder treatment, and a medical-legal partnership for newly arrived immigrant children and families. BHC ensures accessibility through bilingual providers, translation services, transportation assistance, and low-cost prescription medication.
