



Idaho Children's Health Project



The Idaho Children's Health Project (ICHP) provides medical, dental and behavioral health care to low-income, uninsured, and medically underserved children and their families in rural communities throughout South Central Idaho. ICHP operates a combination of fixed site clinics and mobile dental clinics. During the school year, ICHP primarily serves low-income, uninsured families and during the summer months, migrant seasonal farm workers are added to their patient population. Many of these individuals have limited access to health care, often due to a lack of insurance, public transportation, and language barriers. For some, getting care is especially difficult because they live as far as an hour away from a facility. ICHP uses their mobile clinics to address these barriers to care.
