The New Orleans Children's Health Project (NOCHP), a collaboration between Children's Health Fund and CrescentCare, is a new partnership formed in 2025 built upon CHF's 20 year investment in the New Orleans Community in collaboration with Tulane University School of Medicine. CrescentCare is a Federally Qualified Health Center offering an expanded range of health and wellness services for anyone seeking healthcare services in Greater New Orleans and Southeastern Louisiana. Due to rapid population shifts after Katrina, many patients are immigrant or asylum-seeking children. The CrescentCare team offers comprehensive pediatrics services as well as specialty services for disability management, behavioral health, mental health, and psychiatry. Support services include case management, chronic disease management, peer support, life skills, nutrition, insurance enrollment, tobacco cessation, harm reduction, health education, and addiction recovery programs. CrescentCare's goal is clear: To strengthen the entire community through whole-person healthcare and education.
