



Trenton Children's Health Project



The Trenton Children's Health Project (TCHP), a partnership between Henry J. Austin Health Center (HJAHC) and Children's Health Fund (CHF), was launched in 2019. The program provides quality healthcare for communities in underserved areas of greater Trenton, New Jersey. The leading healthcare center in Mercer County, Henry J. Austin Health Center, reaches about one-third of Trenton's population, of which more than 30% are children. By integrating primary care, mental health, and substance abuse services, TCHP effectively serves patients with multiple needs. Patients can receive comprehensive primary care, pediatrics, women's health, behavioral health, dental, vision, pharmacy, and podiatry services. Clinical pharmacists embedded within healthcare teams help make recommendations on appropriate therapies. The program serves all Mercer County residents regardless of whether they have health insurance. To reach children in neighboring communities, TCHP plans to launch a mobile clinic program in partnership with the local school system.
